## Early Voting for November 4, General Election Began Today

(**Columbus**) Absentee voting, both in-person and by mail, began today for the November 4, 2025 General Election. As of this morning, 4,129 absentee ballots have been requested in Franklin County. Those absentee ballots will be delivered to the post office today to coincide with the first day of early voting. Completed absentee ballots by mail must be returned to the Franklin County Board of Elections office no later than 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4.

This election, voters will have the opportunity to vote on Franklin County Municipal Court Judge, Municipal contests for City Attorney, City Auditor, City Council, School Board, Village Council, Township Trustee, Educational Service Center Board, ADAMH, Columbus Zoo Levy, and other local options and tax levies.

Below are the in-person voting hours that Franklin County registered voters can vote at 1700 Morse Road, Columbus:

- Weekdays, October 7 through October 24 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Monday, October 27 from 7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.
- Tuesday, October 28 from 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. \*Last Day to Request Absentee Ballots
- Wednesday, October 29 through October 31 7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.
- Saturday, November 1 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- Sunday, November 2 from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
